



NATIONAL ROAD FRONTIER DINNER

A fabulous evening along the Historic National Road

Casual dress is required - don't forget a sweater for later in the evening!

You are cordially invited to attend the National Road Heritage Corridor's 9th Annual Frontier Dinner at Christian Klay Winery in Chalk Hill, PA just off the Historic National Road on Friday, September 5, 2014 beginning with starters at 6:00 p.m. and dinner at 6:45 p.m., with music by The Sutch Sounds and a pre-dinner hay ride for those who wish to take a tour of the winery.

Join us on the grounds of the winery for a gourmet five course dinner (menu on reverse side) including wine, beer and soft drinks all night, and a bonfire complete with marshmallows to end the night. Firefly Chocolates, Everyday Therapeutics Massage and Leaning House Cigars will be with us again along with some fabulous Chinese and Silent Auction items!

And, for the first time we will welcome an encampment of the 1st Virginia Regiment, who will display their period muskets, pistols, tomahawks, swords, knives and other accoutrements. Willy Frankfort - one of five master horners in the world - will have a large display of his horn and scrimshaw work that includes: cups, powder horns, flasks and mugs. The Bloody Dirk 18th Century Tavern will be open and serving samples of a variety of period drinks, such as apple pie and rum punch.

The Virginia Regiment was formed in 1754 by Virginia's Royal Governor Robert Dinwiddie, initially as an all volunteer militia corps. He promoted George Washington to its command upon the death of Colonel Joshua Fry. Washington, who had previously been a lieutenant colonel of the Virginia militia, received a promotion to colonel when he assumed command. The regiment served in the French and Indian War, with members participating in actions (all under Washington's command) at Jumonville Glen and Fort Necessity in 1754, the Braddock expedition in 1755, and the Forbes expedition in 1758. Small detachments of the regiment were involved in numerous minor actions along Virginia's extensive wilderness frontier.
